Leading clinical education and healthcare

UniSC is at the forefront of quality health and clinical education, preparing graduates with skills to diagnose and treat health issues from nutrition, public health, occupational therapy, prosthetics and orthotics, through to pathology and medical science to name a few.



UniSC medical and health science students undertake clinical placements, treat patients under supervision and use cutting edge technology and simulators to hone their knowledge and skills.

We are the top ranked public university in Australia for teaching quality in Health Services and Support, according to the Good Universities Guide 2023/24.

Our students undertake clinical placements in hospitals across Queensland, and our partnership with the Sunshine Coast University Hospital (SCUH) provides opportunities for hands on clinical training just a short drive from our campus. Co-located with SCUH is the Sunshine Coast Health Institute (SCHI), a shared facility where UniSC and partners undertake research and deliver education programs.

Spanning 3 UNESCO Biosphere Reserves

The campuses of UniSC uniquely span 3 UNESCO Biosphere Reserves:

- Noosa Biosphere Reserve designated in 2007
- Great Sandy Biosphere Reserve designated in 2009 and encompassing RAMSAR wetlands and World Heritage K'gari
- Sunshine Coast Biosphere Reserve designated in 2022

The UNESCO Biosphere Reserves are internationally recognised learning places for sustainable development – special places for exploring and broadening our understanding of social and ecological interactions.

A healthy teaching and learning environment

UniSC has close working relationships with the traditional custodians of K'gari (formally known as Fraser Island) and the Fraser Coast region, Heron Island, Stradbroke Island, the Atherton Tableland, Cape York and Central Australia.

Our teaching and research activities connect with the Moreton Bay Marine Park, Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service, Australia Zoo Wildlife Hospital and Kingfisher Bay Resort.

UniSC has international linkages with Harvard Forest (Harvard University's 3,500 acre laboratory), Bonne Bay Marine Station of Canada and Florida Gulf Coast University.





Powering innovation with clean energy

In partnership with Veolia, UniSC has installed more than 6,000 solar panels and a 'water battery' or thermal energy storage tank to reduce energy consumption on its main campus by 40 per cent. In a first for an Australian university, the initiative is projected to save \$100 million and 100,000 tonnes of CO2 emissions over 25 years. The initiative is a key stepping stone in UniSC's longstanding goal to achieve net zero carbon emissions by 2025.

Five star learning and teaching

Based on the latest graduate and student experience surveys, the 2023-24 Good Universities Guide has rated UniSC as Australia's number one public university for overall postgraduate student experience, and the second best nationwide for undergraduates. UniSC welcomes strong engagement with business and industry. Together we can broaden industry experience opportunities with our diverse partners coming from the private, public, government, start-ups and global partners.

Novel industry placement tackles aged care workforce crisis

As Australia's aged care sector struggles with critical workforce shortages, UniSC has partnered with leading aged care provider Lutheran Services to offer nursing students final year clinical placements in an aged care setting. By enabling nursing students to participate in supervised practice at a registered nurse level, they have an unrivalled opportunity to experience what it's like to work as an RN in aged care, fast-tracking their development into work-ready graduates. Following a successful pilot project, the program is now delivered twice yearly across three Lutheran Services aged care sites, with potentially many more to follow. Several of the UniSC nursing participants in the pilot program secured employment with Lutheran Services on graduation - again with potentially many more to follow.

Boosting IT graduate credentials

UniSC is building job-ready skills and credentials for technology students by embedding industry certifications into their coursework and assessment – so students can gain additional certifications as part of their degree, at no additional cost. Industry certifications and badges are available with Microsoft, ITS, CISCO and EC-Council. The added skills and credentials are helping our IT graduates to secure highly competitive internships and jobs.
